PRESIDENT'S REPORT 2018

My second year as Zone President, I have been getting around the Zone to meetings at clubs and have nearly been to them all. The AGM for the Clarence was held at South Grafton, and it was great to attend again. This year the Positions were all filled and the District has a new driving force in it. Northern Rivers has been filling their spots but like most districts it can be a struggle to get people to contribute in some way to our game. With the Zone now taking our meetings to each District, I thought we would get a lot more reps coming. Some meetings have been well attended and others not so good. I still believe we can get a better input from those clubs throughout the Zone and be of greater assistance to them by taking the meeting around the Zone.

The Zone seniors team travelled to North Beach near Coffs. For the first time they came home with the Black Paddles Shield.

I travelled down to the Fig Tree RSL Wollongong with the Senior State Interzone. The Team played well but didn't handle the one green that was made of Green Leaves Park (a Different Grass to what we normally play on). We were beaten by the winners overall and only around the 10 shots in it. Well done to the players and to our new Selectors (Barry, Brian, Gibbo); hard work and new strategy seems to be working. We all enjoyed the trip but our success was only in the mateship that we found when down there.

The Australian Open has still been high on the agenda, with several meetings being held, between myself and Tony Sherwill (Chief Operating Officer Bowls Australia) Neil Dalrymple (Bowls Australia CEO). The decision on who will host the next period is still up for grabs. Our potential hosting was discussed again at length and we are in with a big chance at some time in the future. Those clubs from the border down to Ballina and across to the Lismore area will all be needed to run this two weeks of bowls. This is the biggest lawn bowls event in the world, they tell me.

I will attend the Zone Pennants playoffs at Pottsville (1st and 2nd Division) and Ballina RSL (3rd and 6th division) The 4th,5th, and 7s will be at East Lismore. All the greens look great and ready to go.

I am now looking forward again to work with the incoming Zone committee and would like to thank those for their efforts in the past year and those who have done so much for our Zone over the many years we have been going.

Looking forward to see everybody at the Johnston Dignan Shield and Schipp Cup. I have talked to Vince Schipp and he is not well enough to travel at this time and hopes to be up and at them in the next year when it is held in his area.

STATE COUNCILLOR'S REPORT - 2017/18

This year has been marked by completion of the Suiko Governance and Organisational Review of BowlsNSW. To date, there seems to have been little opportunity for debate about the seventeen recommendations emanating from the review. BowlsNSW Board has indicated it has noted the findings and will consider further action in the coming year. Some of the recommendations should be of more than passing interest to zone one bowlers and clubs notably that Bowls NSW must adopt a stronger club centric approach. To achieve this Suiko suggests that districts and State Council should be abolished to give BowlsNSW better direct contact with bowls clubs, on the basis that clubs are now the members, as distinct from individual bowlers. No substanstive evidence is presented to support this proposal nor many of the reports other recommendations. Indeed, in Zone One at least, I have been able to discover only one person (myself) who had the opportenity to talk direct with the consultants during their survey of bowlers. To date there has been no action to abolish State Council although the opportunity for debate at meetings appears to have reduced during my short two year experience of meetings. One major initiative of Council has been to identify four specific areas of concern – communication, survival of small clubs, membership and recruitment and junior bowls. It was agreed that these items would be on the council agenda each meeting, but after two subsequent meetings this has not yet happened. At the last Council five zones (including zone one) specifically requested it be implemented. BowlsNSW also has its own priority issues which council usually addresses each meeting - Coaching, Marketing and Governance. My reports to each council meeting now specifically cover each of these seven topics as they impact Zone One and the Zone requests districts and clubs to consider them in their regular meetings.

In closing I would like to thank all those bowlers and club officials who have supported me as State Councillor. At present State Council is the best means of clubs and their members having a serious hearing along with other zones. It is in our interest that State Council continues. I am up for re-election at the forthcoming Zone AGM and I hope you will continue with your support.

COMMUNICATION REPORT

After last year's unfortunate experience with the zone website and facebook page Zone One was unsuccessful in finding a volunteer to take on an information technology advisory role with the zone, to help resurect our on-line presence. Vice President Gary Tobin took on the task of advising on alternative directions for our website and facebook pages. As part of this work I reviewed all the websites of other zones in New South Wales, a report that was tabled at a regular zone meeting and made available to all delegates. Zone One is the only zone that does not have an operating website. Across the state, zone websites range from excellent with informative and up-to-date material and good user interfaces, but a number are not maintained and provide limited information for viewers. Most of these zone websites are based on technology provided free of charge by Bowls Australia (BA). However, recently, BA changed its IT partner and it is only in the past month or so, that agreements were finalised to transfer zone websites from the old platform to the new. We do not know whether Zone One's website will be included in this agreement as it was not operational at the changeover. Meanwhile Gary Tobin sought commercial quotes for the building of a zone webpage. At its last meeting, zone decided to wait until there was clarity about whether we could get a web page built free of charge by the new BA IT partner, or whether we should go it alone. At the time of writing this has yet to be resolved.

JUNIORS' REPORT

The only juniors event run this year was the Zone singles championship won last year by Oscar Forrester from Evans Head. There were six players entered this year a significant increase on the three of last year. Kyogle nurtured three players with others coming from South Lismore (2), and Evans Head. Champion Billy Drooger (*pic below*) of South Lismore went onto the state finals but had no success against experienced and well coached opposition. The zone has perhaps been remiss during the year in not emphasising youth development as much as it should. We need to decide the status of the the Bowls Far North Coast Youth Academy based at Ballina RSL Bowls Club, which will be a priority in 2018/19.



SECRETARY'S REPORT

During 2017/18 we have consolidated many aspects of the zone's operations. As ever, John Rae and George Newell have been committed to managing and coordinating bowls activities, competitions and championships at the zone level. All events seem to have run with few, if any problems. Zone team manager, Brian Moore has worked tirelessly with his selectors and team members (of which President Kris Lehfeldt is one), to give the various zone one teams every chance of success in interzone competition. As secretary, I have now settled into my new home in Ballina and into the role. I hope District officials have found their relationship with the zone useful and productive. My thanks goes out to district secretaries for keeping the zone up-to-date with events and happenings and for responding to our requests for information. Rotation of zone meetings around the districts continued this year but attendence other than from district delegates was less than in the previous year. Either clubs believe we are doing a good job or perhaps the meetings are just boring. I encourage clubs to come along when zone meetings are in your district or town – this is your chance to personally quiz zone executives and to get your concerns off your chest. We will continue to rotate meetings in the coming year and we thank host clubs in advance

In addition to inter-zone championships the zone runs its own championships for winners of districts' singles, pairs, triples and fours competitions, as well as championships to determine which district pennant teams go through to annual state championships. We also are required to manage and monitor the annual Rookies. We especially thank clubs that have assisted us as venues for zone championships during the year. John Rae manages our records of team, club and bowlers' performances without which the following pages could not be delivered. Thank you John.

EVENTS AND FIXTURES IN 2019

Director George Newell has already made progress with devising the zone calendar for 2019. Hopefully, this will be an easier task than last year when we had more than usual state, national and international events to take into account. George will be working closely with district Match Committees to introduce more common dates for both district and club events and endeavouring to minimise clashes of keynote club events. The program will soon be available in draft at the moment and will be circulated as soon as possible. George has also been the zone representative at at least two State Match Committee Forums which are becoming regular annual sessions where all zones meet with the SMC to hear and to advise on all aspects of the coming season's competitions.


